Mark 10:1-12

Divorce and remarriage can be the third rail of religious life. You are almost certain to alienate half of your group if you mention it. Some church leaders allow for divorce and remarriage under no circumstances while other permit it for the smallest offense. The Pharisees sought to trap Jesus by bringing Him into the debate on divorce in Mark 10:1-12. Jesus, in boldness and clarity, shows us the holy place marriage holds in the Kingdom of God.
